Rules & Regulations

*NOTE NEW STARTING TIME

1. All events are sanctioned by the Eastern United States Pipe Band Association (EUSPBA). All competitors in sanctioned events must be a member in good standing of EUSPBA or other recognized piping association. All EUSPBA rules and regulations apply. If you require an application for membership, contact the piping or drumming/pipe band director.

2. Entries must be postmarked by April 20, 2010. To receive a complimentary ticket & entry confirmation, SEND A SELF ADDRESSED/STAMPED ENVELOPE with your entry.

*3. Solo Piping & Drumming Registration will begin at 8:00 AM. Competition will begin at 8:30 AM.

4. The competitions will be held rain or shine, except in case of severe weather.

5. All competitors (except Gr. V piping and drumming) must compete in highland attire.

6. Gr. IV is split into two separate categories according to age: 17 & under (Jr.) and age 18 & older (Sr.) A cutoff date of March 1st will be used to determine in which category an individual is eligible to compete.

7. Gr. V is restricted to those playing the practice chanter only in competition and is not open to those playing bagpipes in solo or band competition. Competitors in Gr. V piping are not required to be members of EUSPBA or another recognized piping association. The requirement for Gr. V Piping is one four-parted or two different two-parted marches in 2/4, 4/4 or 6/8 time.

8. Order of play will be determined by the reverse order in which entries are received. The first entry received will be the last to play.

9. Awards will be given for first through third place in each event. The piping and drumming directors have the right to award one less prize than the number of competitors.

10. Piper of the Day and Drummer of the Day awards will be given to a piper and drummer so judged based on the accumulated points earned during the day's competition.

11. All protests should be made in writing and lodged with the Contest Committee, whose decision shall be binding by all parties concerned.

12. All pipers and drummers are encouraged to play with the massed bands at 11:45 AM and 5:00 PM. See the Head Drum Major upon arrival for more information.

13. Pipe Band Competition may be cancelled or abridged at the discretion of the contest committee. All eligible bands will receive travel money if their competition is cancelled.

THE WEST VIRGINIA PIPE BAND CHAMPIONSHIP

2:00 PM

Only Pipe Bands registered with the EUSPBA or other Pipe Band Association recognized by the EUSPBA will be accepted. Upon being entered, each band will receive passes for each of their registered competing members and their Drum Major as shown on a list submitted with the entry. If a lesser number of players actually appears on the field for the massed bands, they must return extra passes or have \$15 per short deducted from their travel money.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

.....Any of the paid invited bands that have performed at our previous 8 Festivals will again be paid and they are eligible to compete, but if any of them wins, they will receive only bragging rights and points.....
in addition to

.....Any other bands that wish to compete (limit of 12 total bands in competition) will be eligible for the following awards:

Grade III - 1st, \$600; 2nd, \$500; 3rd, \$400

Grade IV - 1st, \$500; 2nd, \$400; 3rd, \$300

Grade V - 1st, \$450; 2nd, \$375; 3rd, \$275

All bands in competition are eligible to win the West Virginia Championship Trophy.

EUSPBA BAND SELECTION REQUIREMENTS

Refer to EUSPBA rules for tune selection or Medley/Set requirements.

GRADE III - Submit ONE 3-5 minute Medley and ONE MS&R

GRADE IV - Submit ONE 3-5 minute Medley and ONE 2/4 march set

GRADE V - Submit ONE 2/4 set or 4/4 march set

All bands must participate in both the 11:45 AM and 5:30 PM massed bands in order to be eligible for prize and travel money. A contest committee will handle the drawing for the Competition Order of Play. Drawing and final instructions will take place at the Registration Tent at 10 AM. A band representative must be present at this meeting.
